Remainder Bingo

You need: two sets of 13 counters (each set in a different colour), two dice, a classmate

This is a game for two players. The winner is the first player to get four counters in a row horizontally, vertically, or diagonally.



How to play

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GAME

Roll both dice. The larger number is the divisor, and the smaller number is the remainder.

Try to find a number on the game board that represents the dividend in an equation.

For example, if you roll 5 and 4, the 5 is the divisor and the 4 is the remainder, so you could cover one of the following numbers on the board as your dividend:

14, 19, 29, 39, or 64 (14 \div 5 = 2 r 4, 19 \div 5 = 3 r 4, and so on). If both dice numbers are the same, treat the remainder as 0.

For example, with 4 and 4 on the dice, you could cover 16, 36, 48, 64, 56, 28, or 32 ($16 \div 4 = 4 \text{ r 0}$, and so on).

- Once a number is covered, it cannot be used again.
- If you are unable to cover a number, you miss that turn.
